- 1st full year as Superintendent, 10th year with the district
- State of the district
 - o Board:
 - Shawn added to board and already making an impact
 - 3 board seats open next year (Dr Davies, Steve Chen, Sean)
 - Reinstated office hours
 - Superintendent Parent Advisory Committee

- Students:
 - 3100 students overall, 1850 at LGHS
 - Population decreasing then expected to plateau
- New police captain and new school resource officer
- Seeking approval for Knowledge Saves Lives (Analysis of campus safety) at next Board meeting. Looking to include recommendations in next facilities master plan
- o Facilities Master Plan:
 - Discovery phase complete: 1st of 4 phases
 - Gym is 80 years old, Industrial Arts wing is 65 years old
 - Partnering with local architect: ABA
- CA Healthy Kids Survey
 - Staff/parents added to survey 3 years ago
 - Most areas up or above pre-COVID numbers
 - Staff climate/culture increased from 63 to 93%
- o CAASPP Data to be released this Friday: #2 in CA for Math/Language Arts
- Course: 22 AP classes offered vs national average of 8
- New cell phone policy: increased interactions and zero issues
- Free meals for all students, food from scratch
- o WE Inspire:
 - Strategic plan now in 2nd year
 - How to meet needs of all learners/how they learn best
- HR working on improving onboarding process
- Expanding stakeholder input on grading policy
- Competing priorities/State requirements:
 - PRISM: supporting LGBT community
 - SB88: drug testing/training requirements for transportation
 - WVPP: Workplace Violence protection Plan
 - AB 2534: Must get certificated verification from previous districts prior to hiring
 - CCGI: CA College Guidance Initiative
 - Personal finance graduation requirements starting with class of 2031
- o Al:
 - Piloting a lockdown browser (Go Guardian)
 - Committee looking into how we use AI to ensure authentic work
